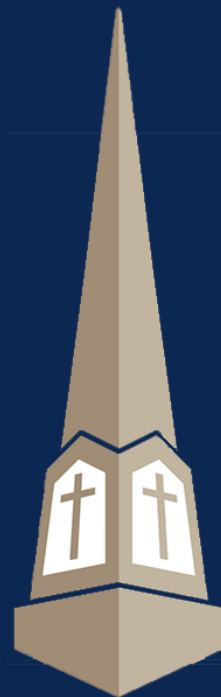


PRAYER STARTERS
